

HOW TO MOUNT A PALLET

It is important that a pallet be well mounted so that it is stable and the cases do not fall.

You must keep the original cases of beer and the delivery trays to reuse for pallets of empty bottles to return.

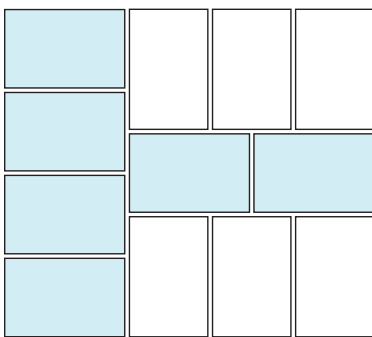
When wrapping the pallet with plastic wrap, start at the wooden base and make 2 turns (2 layers) with the plastic wrap.

Aerial view of a palette

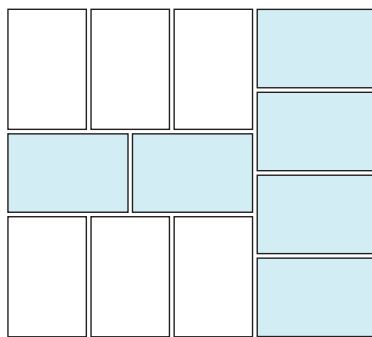
Reverse cases from one row to another for stability (see T-shape below).

Maximum height of 7 rows in total for one pallet.

For Molson and Labatt, use green pallets identified with their name only.



Example: row 1

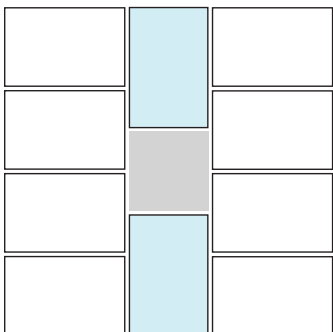


Example: row 2

**This example is made according to cases of 24 bottles:
7 rows of 12 cases = 84 cases.**

Cases of 28 bottles of 341 ml

7 rows of 18 cases = 126 cases per pallet

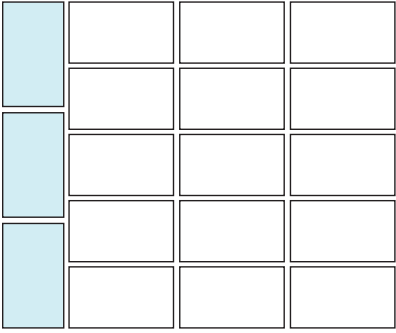


Important

Recycan boxes are for the exclusive use of Molson and Labatt bottles

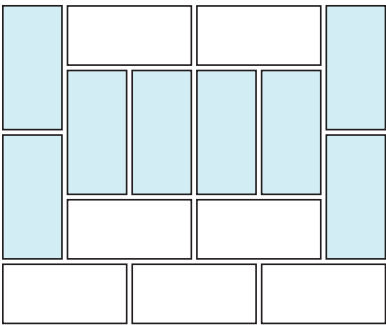
Cases of 15 bottles of 341 ml

7 rows of 18 cases = 126 cases per pallet



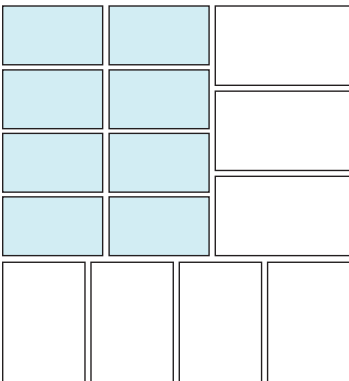
Cases of 8 bottles of 1.18 L

5 rows of 15 cases = 75 cases per pallet



Cases of 15 bottles and 24 bottles

8 cases of 15 bottles and 7 cases of 24 bottles = 1 pallet row



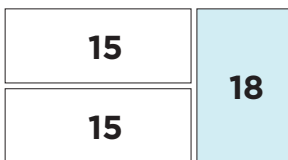
GOOD TO KNOW

If you have other case sizes or do not have enough cases to make a pallet row:

Cases of 6 or 12 beers: put them in a delivery tray.

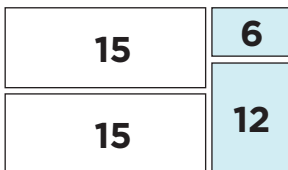
2 cases of 15 bottles + 1 case of 18 bottles

= 2 cases of 24 bottles side by side



2 cases of 15 bottles + 1 case of 12 bottles + 1 case of 6 bottles

= 2 caisses de 24 bouteilles collées



1 case of 20 bottles + 1 case of 28 bottles

= 2 cases of 24 bottles if they are put end to end
